100 things to do this Summer When the season is over you can still train to sharpen your skills. Try these challenges at home. 1. Play the ball against a gable wall 100 times. See how many ways you control or strike it with your chest, head and feet. 2. On rainy days use four socks to mark out a 1 m square on the kitchen floor. Move the ball around inside the square at speed. See if you can manage 100 touches in one minute without losing control. 3. Or how about 100 kick-ups (keepie uppies or freestyling)? Ten would be pretty good for a beginner! Dan Magness (27 years old) holds the world record for freestyling. In 2010 he kept a ball going for 26 hours! We had our own visiting freestyler at Colga this year when Polish supremo Sebastien (picture) gave a demonstration for all the Cadets.
